

Below are the rules for our day and the saving dates for animals.

- Children's ages to be as at day of judging.
- No two pupils can show Calf, Lamb or Kid.
- No animals to be carrying lice.
- 4. Animals must have been first shown at School Day to become eligible for Group Day unless an exemption is granted due to illness or other exceptional circumstances.
- Parents may assist their children in cleaning animals on arrival at Agriculture Day.
- Pre-schoolers are welcome to compete at school but MOTGroup or Show Days.
- 7. For Championship Ribbons to be awarded there needs to be at least 8 children competing in one section (e.g. calves, lambs or kids).

SECTION RULES:

Calves – Dairy or Beef

- 1. Bull calves are accepted at Agricultural Day but Group Day and Show Day rules may differ so inquire where applicable.
- Calves must not be clipped or oiled.
- TB Certificates are to accompany all calves to all competition Days.
- 4. Saving dates for calves are:

Early - 10th June to 31st July

Late - 1st August to 20th September.

Lambs.

- Must not be washed they may be covered and brushed.
- Ram lambs are accepted at Agriculture Day but Group Day and Show Day rules may differ so inquire where applicable.
- Saving Dates for lambs are:

Early- 10th July to 19th August

Late- 20th August to 20th September.


Kids.

- Any breed or combination of breeds will be accepted.
- Milking, Meat or Feral Goats may be washed and brushed but not fibre goats (e.g. Angora, Mohair etc).
- 3. Buck kids are accepted at Agriculture Day but Group Day or Show Day rules may differ so inquire where applicable.
- 4. Saving Dates for kids are:

Early - 1st July to 19th August

Late - 20th August to 20th September.

I hope everyone has either started to rear a calf, lamb or kid or will soon start! Forms regarding your pet will be sent home soon.

Livestock Improvement has developed a free website, www.calfclub.co.nz for rural schools and children which gives an easy to follow guide on the selection, care and training of calves for calf club. The site is written in a style which will appeal to children between 5 and 12.

Registration forms will be available from the school office, in a HERO post or can be downloaded from the website once the date has been confirmed.



Ribbon printing is a major fundraiser for our school that we do in term 3 each year. We print and cut about 3000 award ribbons for Vetora (our Group Day sponsor) and approximately 15 other schools.

We make around \$7000.00 profit to help your child's education.

We will need helpers for

Ribbon cutting (day and night sessions depending on what people prefer)

- a team of 2 - 4 to cut ribbon (at school) to length) with 2 teams working we get through double the amount each session.

Printers – anyone keen to learn a new skill and share the printing job. It is foil on a machine so no smelly ink or paint and no mess to cleanup.

Fringers – an at home job to glue fringing on to champion ribbons

- the more the merrier

We usually create a chat group and post on there when we are doing any of the activities and you can just put your hand up for when suits you.

It is a great way to meet other parents (dads welcome). It's not very hard, very social and no experience needed.

You can give as much or as little time as you like. You may only want to help out at one or two events or you may want to be more involved. Any amount of time that you can give is greatly appreciated.




